Our Most Valued Treasure

As Jesus went on His way, a man ran up to Him and fell on his knees before Him. "Good teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

"Why do you call Me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good—except God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honor your father and mother."

"Teacher," he declared, "all these I have kept since I was a boy."

Jesus looked at him and loved him. "One thing you lack," He said. "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow Me."

At this the man's face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth. (Mark 10:17-22)

I suspect this man probably believed Jesus was the Messiah, and he wanted to know how to qualify for eternal life. Some people embrace the same question; "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" How do I qualify myself? Some may want to avoid hell. I think most people who don't actually know Jesus hope to be good enough to deserve heaven, rather than hell.

Jesus tells him to obey all of God's original commandments. His enquiry is earnest, and he honestly says it has always been his purpose to govern his life by them. Jesus knew the man's heart, just as He knows ours, and realized there was something of great earthly value to him that he clung to above everything.

Though honest and genuine, the man did not understand that eternal life resides in Christ Jesus, and belongs to those who value Him more than anything, everything and everyone else. He did not know that, as the Apostle Paul did (**Philippians 3:7-8**), valuing everything other than Christ

as worthless, compared to Christ, is what secures eternal life with The Savior.

Because Christ is more valuable to us than life itself, and anything or anyone else, we would gladly discard anything that would come between us and the One who sacrificed His life for us, making eternal life available to us.

What do we value highly in our life? Might it be wealth and possessions, like the man in the story? Or could it be accomplishments and recognition, like the Apostle Paul? Maybe it is someone we love, our education or career; maybe it could be a rewarding pastime like hiking, or fishing, golf or sewing. It could be family heirlooms or other possessions we worked and saved long and hard to obtain. It could be a compelling indulgence, even a necessity like food. Some people's lives have become dominated by political convictions, or fear of some earthly liability, or another.

Is there anything in our life we would not forsake for Christ? Have we committed to the willingness to live sacrificially for Him, in response to His ultimate sacrifice for us? Are we dedicated to freely offer forgiveness to anyone who wrongs us, just as He offers forgiveness to us at His own expense? I am saddened to read of the ongoing vindictive unforgiveness toward politicians some people detest, boldly announced on the Internet for all the world to see. Can such embraced hostility reside in a heart surrendered to The Savior?

Each of us must evaluate ourselves before Him. What honors or dishonors His name among those who don't yet know of His love and sacrifice for them? The Apostle Paul also wrote, "whatever is not from faith is sin." (**Romans 14:23**)

Live free in faith, for the approval of Christ alone. When we have His, no one else's matters.
