Seasons

June. Many think summer starts in June. Those of us who grew up around Puget Sound realize it's most likely to begin in July... July 5th to be precise. But we get glimpses of it in June. Either way, the season changes from spring to summer.

Even though people from elsewhere think it rains year-round here, summer is actually very nice. 70-80 degrees with a cool, gentle breeze off of that gorgeous body of cold, inland sea water. When it's nice here, it's not nicer anywhere. If God ever leaves the choice up to me, I'll live right here.

We get four real seasons in western Washington, none of them extreme. It can be a little wetter, longer than we would like in winter. But I'll take that over 100-120 degrees and huddled inside during summer because it's broiling outside.

Genesis 1:14 says God put the lights in the sky to distinguish between night and day, and signs and seasons. In our mild climate, I appreciate all four seasons God has ordained; Winter, spring, summer & fall. All are different and all provide something to look both forward to, and beyond. Looking behind, there is nothing coming, and standing still is not an option.

The seasons of life God has ordained are not limited to weather. **Ecclesiastes 3:1-8** reveals many of them. Lamenting any coming or current season is a futility that brings only discouragement. A simple wisdom I embraced from my best friend's father growing up is to, "Play the hand you're dealt." Yes, play it well, to the best of your ability with the cards God gave you. But wishing it were not, won't produce anything positive. Play the hand you are dealt, like Gandalf told Frodo.

Psalm 1:1-3 reveals that, "Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful; (*Plenty of that going around today*) but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in His law he meditates day and night. (*God's law is not an imposition of requirements. It is simply the way things really are.*) He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that brings forth its fruit in its season, whose leaf also shall not wither; and whatever he does shall prosper."

I think some of God's people have decided to build what amounts to Hot Houses. Just across the border in Langly, B.C. you can see hundreds of acres of tomatoes growing all year long – in hot houses. Glass houses some call Green Houses. In the U.S. some have attempted to seat the god of productivity beside God who ordained seasons.

It's interesting that in **John 15** Jesus refers to the Father as the master gardener. That's the job Adam had before he sinned. Maybe we are still trying to improve things by taking them into our own hands. I believe God is the original organic gardener, and not only with ingredients. He ordained seasons for fruitfulness, including the seasons of weather and our lives in them. I invite you to pray into **Psalm 1:1-3** deeper, asking God to reveal how it may bring increased blessing to your life. Not all prosperity is measured in quantity. And please join us for our emerging monthly hour of prayer **June 29**th at 1:00 **PM in the SMB**. We are prayer diving into the promises of blessing Jesus delivered in the Father's behalf.

Church BYOL Picnics and Outdoor Game Times


