When Truth is Not Enough

"Truth" – that which is true; a fact; a reality; that which conforms to fact or reality; the real or true state of things. (WEBSTER'S NEW TWENTIETH CENTURY DICTIONARY UNABRIDGED)

Is the truth ever unreliable? Should truth ever be discarded as a deception? Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." Is the truth about Him always trustworthy? Should truth ever be rejected because of who is offering it? Does truth have something behind it that makes it trustworthy? What is its source? Is the truth ever not good enough?

There's an interesting story in Acts 16:16-18. Paul and Silas had planted the first church in the city of Philippi, in the home of an influential woman named Lydia. As they regularly went to pray together, a slave girl possessed with a spirit of divination followed them every day crying out, "These men are the servants of the Most High God, who proclaim to us the way of salvation." That was true. It was true about God, true about who they were and what they were doing.

But after many days of this Paul, greatly annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I command you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And he came out that very hour. Why? Why would Paul object to someone proclaiming the truth about God, and their service to Him? As a result, they were unjustly severely beaten and thrown in prison. However, God then used that to expand the church into the jailer's household, and grant them favor with the very authorities who had abused them. Go figure.

But, back to Paul expelling the demon from the slave girl who was following them around and loudly declaring the very truth they were there to spread. Why was the truth she proclaimed unacceptable? Good question, don't you think?

Truth from a lying source gives credence to the one telling it. You've probably heard the old caution, "Consider the source." That is not only wise when the word being offer is suspect. Any voice from a source contrary to God is a deception. Trusting them because what they say is true can open us to being led astray by subtle lies that follow.

Today, when Artificial Intelligence can be used to persuasively present distortions that contain truth; when formerly trusted leaders, even church leaders, are exposed as practiced liars; who we believe is every bit as important as what we believe.

After leaving Philippi, Paul commended the believers of Berea, that they received the word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so. No trustworthy truth is, or comes from a source contrary to the Lord. Jesus said, "Anyone who is not with Me is against Me, and anyone who does not gather with Me scatters." Bear this in mind with what you consider believing in politics, advertising, entertainment... anything, from anyone, about any subject. Knowing what God has said about any area of life... and He hasn't left anything out, is our safeguard from persuasive deception. Of course, be a person known to be trustworthy and truthful.
