Philippians 3:7-8,

"Whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of **the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord**, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them **garbage**, that I may gain Christ"

Our public policies declare many things to be lawful

Sexual sins, drug abuse & the killing of innocents included

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Yet, we don't participate in them. Why?

Our hearts & minds know they are evil

I Corinthians 6:12,

"All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful (Beneficial). All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any."

Public laws don't define right & wrong, good & evil

So, what defines our lives... yours & mine?

- What influence do we hope to bring to our culture?
- What governs our life's purposes?

Edmund Burke said, "Those who will not govern themselves, require that others govern over them."

What do we most hope to change?

- Public policy, or hearts & minds?

Because what we are, is what we bring

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- And what **we do**, is what **we are**
- Good theology by Bill Parcells, "You're exactly what your record says you are."

We are not responsible for every church expression out there

- We are responsible for this one
- Peninsula Christian Fellowship

Who we are, is the only influence we have...

- On other churches we have relationship with (I Cor. 12)
- On the culture we are planted in (Matt. 13:33)

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Like Paul, our influence isn't supposed to be Christ, plus anything!

- We will either be the influence of who Christ
 is (Acts 1:8)
- Or be influenced by whatever we add to Him
- ONLY the church, His Body, is eternal!

Romans 12:1-2,

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. **Do not** conform to the pattern of this world, but **be transformed by the renewing of your mind**. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—His good, pleasing and perfect will."

- What we believe determines what we do...
- What we do defines who we are...
- How we live is our evidence of who God is

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Hebrews 13:8, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever."

So... Who is He, and where do we start?

He said, "Follow Me", "Do as I do", "Love like I love."
