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He's asking if we possess **the truth** & **treasures** of the kingdom

- Truths & treasures **He just took the time to explain**
- Then He tells us what they consist of

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I don't doubt that much of what they just heard was **new to them**

- Some of it was probably contrary to what they thought already

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Are new things God gives supposed to **replace** the former?

 Or are they intended to add to, making both better?

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Matthew 9:16-17, "No one puts a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old garment; for the patch pulls away from the garment, and the tear is made worse. Nor do they put new wine into old wineskins, or else the wineskins break, the wine is spilled, and the wineskins are ruined. But they put new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved."

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Unshrunk = not yet prepared for application & use
Old wineskins = stiff, inflexible & unyielding

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Matthew 5:17, "Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill."

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Matthew 8:2-4, And behold, a leper came and worshiped Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean." Then Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." Immediately his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus said to him, "See that you tell no one; but go your way, show yourself to the

priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them." (The old is not discarded)
