Faith & Authority Matthew 8:1-17

Matthew 8:1, When He had come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed Him.

Matthew 5:1, Seeing the multitudes, He went up on a mountain, and when He was seated His disciples came to Him.

Two environments:

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- 1) Devoted followers, separated to Him
- 2) Great multitudes, swarming around Him

8:2, And behold, **a leper came** and worshiped Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."

And behold, a leper came and worshiped Him

- His absolute need compelled him to come to Jesus
- He did not let having no offering keep him from coming
- His absolute need was his life & death offering
- He could have been stoned on the spot
- Or died slowly alone. He knew he was already dead.

Do we realize **our life** & **death need** compels us to come to Him?

A leper came and worshiped Him

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- Worshipping Him for who He is...
- Before he made his request

Do we worship Him for who He is...

- Because He is worthy?

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- **Before** we make our request.
- Regardless of whether He grants it or not

Saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."

He declared Jesus to be his absolute,
 Supreme Master!

7:21, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven." (Matt. 12:50)

5:3, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for **theirs is the kingdom of heaven**."

- The first thing Jesus said in His first ever public teaching
- It's not what we say, but why we say it

"If You are willing, You can make me clean."

- He made his request completely subject to Christ's authority
- Subject to His decision, whatever He chose
- Just as Christ, Himself would do with His life

Mathew 26:38-39, He said, "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death. He went a little farther and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, "O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will."

Just as the apostle Paul would come to accept when his request was not granted

Il Corinthians 12:8-9, Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

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"If You are willing, You can make me clean."

- You can change who & what I am
- Something no one else can do...
- And we cannot do for ourselves
- This is about more than healing disease!

John 8:32 & **36**, "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall **make you free**."

"Therefore **if the Son makes you free**, you shall be free indeed."

He doesn't just change our circumstance, or our body

He changes who & what we are!

"If You are willing, You can make me clean."

- Make me undefiled & clean in Your presence!
- I hope you've had someone who knew you before ask you...
- What happened to you?!

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8:3, Then **Jesus put out His hand and touched him**, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." Immediately his leprosy was cleansed.

When He touched what was unclean it **made Him** unclean!

- Touching him, He demonstrates His acceptance & care for the man
- He also identifies with him & his circumstances
- Just as He did by being baptized.

Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing"

I choose to do this

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- Why?

John 5:19, Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do; for whatever He does, the Son also does in like manner."

- I don't make My own choices
- My choice is to do what the Father reveals

"I am willing; **be cleansed**."

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- With two words, Jesus changed **EVERYTHING!**

The ONE who said, "Let there be light"

- Said, "**Be cleansed,**" and he was

He made everything about this man NEW!

- He gave him perfect health, In exchange for deadly disease!
- Why?
- Because His Father told Him to

Immediately his leprosy was cleansed.

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 Christ's declarations happen when He says them!

(This will be repeated with the next person)

 Because, "The Son can do nothing of Himself"

When someone declares or commands things that don't happen...

- It simply reveals it was **of themselves**, not God.
- God never commands what doesn't happen
- Paul (David) Yonggi Cho, 1987

8:4, And Jesus said to him, "See that you tell no one; but go your way, show yourself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them."

"See that you tell no one"

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- Don't make a spectacle of this
- He had other purposes in mind

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II Corinthians 12:2-4, I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven. Whether it was in the body or out of the body I do not know—God knows. And I know that this man—whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, but God knows— was caught up to paradise and heard inexpressible things, things that no one is permitted to tell.

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"But **go your way**, show yourself to the priest"

 Continue on in your normal course of life (He will repeat this also)

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"Show yourself to the priest"

- Honor God within His established worship expressions
- Telling everyone instead would not honor God's established ways
- He hadn't determined to replace them yet

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"Offer the gift that Moses commanded, **as a** testimony to them."

- Though it didn't come through them...
- You are worshipping & honoring Me without excluding them (They would exclude Christ, instead)

Matthew 9:16, "No one puts a piece of **unshrunk** cloth on an old garment; for the patch pulls away from the garment, and the tear is made worse."

- God's fresh, new ways are supposed to be seasoned to be adapted to what is
- To enhance them, not replace them
- It's human self-centeredness that separates
 God's people

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Matthew 13:52, Then He said to them, "Therefore every scribe instructed **concerning the kingdom of heaven** is like a householder who brings out of his treasure **things new and old**."

- How many professing to be wise, display their ignorance of God's ways?
- Learn from Jesus... to avoid the errors of man
