Learning by Experience Philippians 4:10-23

Paul is drawing this very personal letter to a close.

- He's not writing a text book here
- Have you ever had a letter you **reread** many times?
- He continues to build them up

This includes one of the most distorted & abused verses in the NT

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Vs. 10, "I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at last your care for me has flourished again; though you surely did care, but you lacked opportunity."

They gave him more than provision

- Their genuine care gave him joy!
- Joy in jail, under threat of death
- Great joy In the Lord*
- *"Flourished again"* It's who they Are.
- "Surely you did care". He affirms **he knows** who they are.

Vs. 11, "Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content"

This is not about the money

- God has **used life** to free him from circumstances
- David knew it Psalm 23:1

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I Timothy 6:6-8, "Now godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and clothing, with these we shall be content."

*Hebrews 13:5, "*Let your conduct be without covetousness; **be content with such things as you have**. For He Himself has said, 'I will never leave you nor forsake you.'"

Matthew 20:1-15 – Workers in the marketplace - Contentment not found in comparison

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Vs. 12-13, "I know how to be **abased**, and I know how to **abound**. Everywhere and **in all things** I have learned both to **be full** and to **be hungry**, both to **abound** and to **suffer need**. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

Does it look like he's saying, "I can do anything I set out to do because Christ will empower me to do it?"

- When we attempt to use God's Word **for our purposes**, we've dethroned Him and declared ourselves to be **in His place**.
- That's a dangerous place to be!

Godly contentment is **not defined** or empowered by our circumstance

- When is our rejoicing most rewarding?
- When we are full & satisfied?
- Or when real need arrives?
- Are we equally content in either or both?

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So... what empowers our most enjoyable rejoicing?

- Our Need!

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Vs. 14-15, "Nevertheless you have done well that you shared in my distress. Now you Philippians know also that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church shared with me concerning giving and receiving but you only."

- Devoted, compassionate care distinguishes those who do
- James 2, Talk is cheap. Demonstrate it

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Vs. 16-17, "For even in Thessalonica you sent aid once and again for my necessities. (Vs. 10) Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the fruit that abounds to your account."

- He is rejoicing For Them most! (2:3-4)
- Proverbs 11:25, "The generous soul will be made rich, and he who waters will also be watered himself."

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Vs. 18, "Indeed I have all and abound. I am full, having received from Epaphroditus the things sent from you, a sweet-smelling aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well pleasing to God."

- We are generous to bless others
- But God is pleased even more
- Who is **He** happiest for? **Both**
- Who are they happiest for? Each other

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*Vs. 19, "*And my God shall supply all *your need* according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus."

- Do you need a new Gulfstream? (\$75 Million)

We learn compassionate giving by receiving **when** in need

- Givers are uncomfortable receiving
- Takers feel entitled & don't appreciate it

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Vs. 20, "Now to our God and *Father* be glory forever and ever. Amen."

- God is glorified when we follow His example

Vs. 21-22, "Greet every saint in Christ Jesus. The brethren who are with me greet you. All the saints

greet you, but especially those who are of Caesar's household."

Here is the heart of the whole letter!

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"Greet, Saints & Brethren"

He is using **POWERFUL** words here!

Think of the video of that soldier returning from combat

- The affection, the passion, the embrace!

He is saying, "Receive God's original, sacred family members!"

- With the very affection of Christ!

Psalm 16:2-3, "O my soul, you have said to

the LORD, 'You are my Lord, My goodness is nothing apart from You.' **As for the saints who are on the earth, 'They are the excellent ones, in whom is all my delight**.'"

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The world increasingly **de-personalizes human** interaction

- Reducing it to the digital exchange of data
- As often as possible, automated

The affection of Christ has been reduced to membership of a fraternal or social organization

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Paul loves these people, and he's concerned they are in danger of losing **what Christ died to give us**.

Loneliness comes from having no one to safely share our deepest thoughts & feelings with.

John 13:34, 14:27, 16:33 & 17:20-23

..... He said it to them, and **he's saying it to us**

Vs. 23, "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen."
