More Faith – Same Authority **Matthew 8:5-13**

Matthew is an eye witness to the life & ministry of Jesus

- He is a Jew, writing to Jews about a Jew
- He is writing to people who know God's history with them
- He is writing to **confirm conclusively** their long-promised Messiah King

Matthew writes to **reveal Jesus** as the **One** & **only** Messiah Kina!

.....

.....

He writes to reveal & confirm Him in seven specific ways:

- 1) The Presentation of The King (1:1-4:11)
- 2) The Proclamation of The King (4:12-7:29) (Concluding with the Sermon of the Mount, Ch.5-7)
- 3) **The Power of The King** (8:1-11:1)
- 4) The Progressive Rejection of The King (11:2-16:12)
- 5) The Preparation of The King's Disciples (16:13-20-28)
- 6) The Presentation & Rejection of The King (20:29-27:66)
- 7) **The Proof of The King** (28:1-20)

He guotes & alludes to the Old Testament 130 times

More than any other N.T. book

......

He writes "that what was spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled" nine times

It does not appear in any of the other gospels

Revealing The King, he also declares "the kingdom of heaven"

- He uses this phrase 32 times in his recounting the life of Jesus
- It appears **nowhere else** in the New Testament

8:5, Now when Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to Him, pleading with Him

- Capernaum was a major commercial & social hub
- It was a Roman military garrison city
- What happened there would become known far & wide

A Centurion came to Him, pleading with Him

.....

.....

- A commanding Roman military officer
- Most often in uniform when in public
- In absolute authority over every non-Roman
- He called people to him, he didn't go to them

Pleading with Him

- Pleading = Imploring with need, seeking
- Like the leper, having no sense of belonging or deserving
- Like the leper, subjecting himself to Christ's will & authority

8:6, Saying, "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented."

- Like the leper, "Lord" means Supreme
 Master
- The leper could have been stoned
- This man could have been executed for treason
- In Rome, Caesar was **God above all others**

.....

Could he have asked Caesar to heal him?

- **II Kings 5:7**, Naaman & the king of Israel
- "The king of Israel tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to kill and make alive, that this man sends a man to me to heal him of his leprosy?"

.....

"My servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented."

- The leper was seeking **for himself**
- This Centurion is passionately seeking for someone else
- Not his child, or other family member
- Someone under his authority he has no ability to help
- He doesn't even ask. He is convinced Jesus can heal him.
- He submits his overwhelming need to Jesus's absolute authority

0.7. And the restrict to the first file.

8:7, And Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him."

 Jesus immediately says He will go and meet the need

.....

Matthew 15:21-28, (Vs. 26) He answered and said, "It is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the little dogs."

- Why such a different initial response?
- John 5:19, "The Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do"
- Jesus lives in active submission to the Father (Wine at the wedding)

Jesus is entirely consistent

Not in what He does, but why He does it

.....

8:8-9, The centurion answered and said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed. For I also am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it."

He completely understood **the absolute authority**

of Jesus!

- Far beyond human, earthly authority

- Authority over creation!

.....

......

.....

He would not have asked Caesar to heal him

Like the leper, His faith was in who Jesus is!

- **Not** what He does
- Such faith lives in submission to Christ
- Whatever He does, or does not do

8:10, When Jesus heard it, **He marveled, and said** to those who followed, "Assuredly, I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!"

- People **not submitted** to earthly authority...
- Are not inclined to submit to God's
- People not unconditionally submitted to God's authority...
- Are unlikely to withstand the shaking (Matt. 7:24-27 & Heb. 12:26-29)

8:11-12, And I say to you that many will come from east and west (not Hebrews) and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. But the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and qnashing of teeth."

- Citizenship in the kingdom of heaven is not genetic
- It is gained by absolute submission to & trust in Christ's authority
- God has no grandchildren
- Matthew 7:21 (John 5:19 & 20:21)

.....

8:13, Then Jesus said to the centurion, "**Go your** way; and as you have believed, so let it be done for you." And his servant was healed that same hour.

- Go your way Live your daily life by your faith in Me
- Just as He said to the former leper

"As you have believed" = As you have entrusted yourself

And his servant was healed that same hour.

- As with the leper, **when Jesus spoke it**, it happened

Unconditionally entrusted yourself to who Jesus IS...

- Regardless of what He does or does not do
