# His Cost & Our Healing Matthew 8:14-17

**8:14**, Now when Jesus had come into Peter's house, He saw his wife's mother lying sick with a fever.

- He saw his wife's mother
- The leper & the Centurion approached Him

#### Jesus maintained situational awareness

- Human & Divine
- Earthly & heavenly

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John 5:19, The Son is not able to do anything on His own, but only what He sees the Father doing.

**Luke 19:5**, When Jesus came to the place, **He looked up and said to him**, "Zacchaeus, hurry and
come down because today I must stay at your
house."

Are we **Intentionally aware** of God & those around us?

- Jesus calls us to follow His example, toward God & each other
- You probably notice people who are unaware of those around them
- People thinking only of themselves... in traffic, or the grocery store
- I remember the day I determined to be aware of my surroundings

Would you rather be unnoticed for being aware,

- Or noticed for being unaware?

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- Awareness of the people around us values them
- Many are unaware because they don't value others

He saw his wife's mother lying sick with a fever.

- He was attuned to people suffering around Him
- Some He helped. Some He didn't

**8:15**, And He touched her hand, and the fever left her.

He touched her hand

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- There is no greater human identification with someone than touching
- To touch someone who is suffering values them more than ourselves
- Jesus touched people, including the untouchables
- And people constantly sought to touch Him
- A common defense mechanism is "Don't touch me!"

He touched her hand, and the fever left her.

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- He touched her with all of who He is
- He touched her as one person to another, as the Son of Man
- He touched her imparting all of who He is to her

Sometimes compassion compels us to **reach out to touch someone** 

- But we don't have all of what they need
- Sometimes our touch can bring healing to who they are...
- Even when we can't improve their circumstance
- Our inability to help can seem frustrating

 Jesus didn't heal all the hurting people, all the time

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We can only give from Him, when He is giving it

- As the Father directs Him
- Sometimes He left them; needs unmet
- He trusted the Father, when He gave & when He didn't
- It requires staying in contact with the Father
- And **He gave us that**, to the extent we take Him up on it

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The deepest healing is the **healing of who we are** 

**Psalm 147:3**, He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds (sorrows).

- He has empowered us to do this (Matthew 10:8)
- "Freely you have received, freely give."

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James 5:16, Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

- Healed of what? Our confessed sin. (I John 1:8-10)
- It's common to place our hand on someone as we pray for them
- It symbolizes identification with, and impartation
- I always ask permission if I'm not sure of their preference

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Then she arose and served Him/them.

- The most natural response to being touched
   & healed by Jesus...
- Is serving **Him by serving others** in His behalf (in His name)
- If you wouldn't naturally serve other Do it for Him

8:16, When evening had come.

**8:16**, When evening had come, **they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed**. And He

cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick.

- Someone troubled by demons should be brought to Jesus
- Acts 19:13-16
- Don't use His name unauthorized (John 5:19
   & 20:21)
- There is much error with binding & loosing (Matt. 18)

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## He cast out the spirits with a word

- Please note He did not touch them
- He does not identify with (touch) demons, or their influence
- Though healing usually follows deliverance...
- Casting out evil is not the same as healing afflictions or disease

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#### And healed all who were sick.

- Mark & Luke both say He healed & delivered many, not all
- Mark was taught by Peter & it happened in Peter's house
- We're going to see some times when Jesus healed some...
- And some times He didn't heal any

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**8:17**, That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses." (Isaiah 53:4)

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"He Himself took our infirmities"

- He who made, sustains & restores all things
- On His own. No one assigned this to Him

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John 1:1-3, In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made.

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**Hebrews 1:1-3, God**, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, **has** in these last days **spoken to us by His Son**, whom He has appointed heir of all

## things, through whom also He made

the worlds; who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high

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#### "He Himself took our infirmities"

- **Took** = Obtain possession of, took to Himself
- Not forcefully, but in gentleness
- Infirmities = Feebleness, Frailty or Weakness

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# He makes them His, instead of ours

- He relieves us of them

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#### "And bore our sicknesses."

- **Bore** = To lift & receive, to carry
- He now carries what we used to
- **Sicknesses** = Malady or Disease
- **1995**, "Will you let me do this?"

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#### Matthew 8:1-17

- The leper, the Centurion, someone sick at home
- Whether we come to Him for ourselves or someone else,
- Or whether He enters our environment...
- Will we stay in contact with the Father?
- Will we surrender & relinquish control of our own life & those we love?
- Will we entrust everything too great for us, to Him?
- Fully trusting Him, no matter what He does or does not do
- I admit it seems I have to do this almost every day
- Paul said he did have to do it daily (I Corinthians 15:31)
