In **Genesis 50:19-20** Joseph said to his brothers, "Am I in the place of God? You meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, to bring it about

as it is today"

"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it
does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor
others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily
angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does
not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It
bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things,
endures all things. Love never fails."

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By tying patience to love, God reminds us that patience is **not only about ourselves**

- Love only lives in relationship

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How patient has God been with you?

- Do you just receive it from Him for your benefit?
- Our do you possess it for distribution in His behalf?
- Real growth takes time. It's often a slow process

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Moses moved Israel at a pace **the slowest who** were willing could keep up with.

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II Timothy 2:24, The Lord's bond-servant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all, skillful in teaching, **patient when wronged**

Loving patience can be costly... and valuable

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Matthew 13:45-46, "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant seeking beautiful pearls, who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had and bought it."
