Faithfulness is the full assurance of belief - The absence of belief is unbelief - Unbelief separates from God	- He calls us to join Him in His faithfulness

Matthew 22:37-39, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'

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John 13:34-35, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

- Faithful to not give up, no matter the difficulty
- Unfailing commitment to a friend or loved one
- Whether they love you back or not
