How did He respond? (Vs. 6-10)

6, So the Lord said, "If you have faith as a mustard seed, you can say to this mulberry tree, 'Be pulled up by the roots and be planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."

- If your faith is grounded in God's natural order of life first ...
- Your growth will come as surely as that tree grows from seed to maturity.
- So, how does God's natural order work in our lives of faith?

Vs. 7-8, "And which of you, having a servant plowing or tending sheep, will say to him when he has come in from the field, 'Come at once and sit down to eat'? But will he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for my supper, and gird yourself and serve me till I have eaten and drunk, and afterward you will eat and drink'"?

The disciples say to the Lord, "Increase our faith."

Were they **slipping** into thinking they were **more than servants**?

 Jesus addressed their ambitions several times

Matthew 20:25-28, But Jesus called them to Himself and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and those who are great exercise authority over them. Yet it shall not be so among you; but whoever desires to become great among you, let him be your servant. And whoever desires to be first among you, let him be your slave— just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

- Had they ever seen Him treat someone as if He were their boss?
- Jesus led by example, and calls us to follow Him in it

**Romans 12:2**, And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

This is about more than theology

- How much of the church is following the world's example of structure & leadership?

Vs. 9-10, "Does he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I think not. So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do.'"

Holman Christian Standard calls them, "good for nothing slaves"

**ESV**, **NIV** & **NLT** all say "unworthy servants" The Greek means, "**Unmeritorious slave**" or bond servant, **in subjugation**.

This is what we aspire to...
 (Surrender, Submission & Subjection)

I think they all fail to communicate

"Unmeritorious" well – without merit.

- Meaning We merit nothing by our service to our Master
- We've earned NOTHING! Including our faith

**Ephesians 2:8-9**, For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; **it is the gift of God**, not of works, lest anyone should boast.

- **He gives**, we receive... or not

"For **by grace** you have been saved **through faith**"... both as gifts of God

- "Blessed are **the poor in spirit**, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (**Matt.5:3**)
- The **FIRST** promised blessing Jesus taught

What is His answer to how we increase our faith?

- Keep doing our **first faith** humble **work!**
- True faith **never** outgrows humility & service

Embrace **the heart of a servant** in faith, and work like one

- Servants don't do what they want
- They do what they're told, like Jesus did (John 5:19 & 30)

.....

Philippians 2:5-8, Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider equality with God as something to be used for His own advantage. Instead, He made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. (James 4:10 & I Peter 5:6)

**Colossians 3:23-24**, And whatever you do, do it heartily, **as to the Lord** and **not to men**, knowing that from the Lord you will receive **the reward of the inheritance**; for you **serve** the Lord Christ.

- We don't earn & deserve the reward
- **We inherit it** as family with Jesus
- He took what we deserved, so we could inherit what is His
