We Need Bread Matthew 6:9-11

"Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread."

Seven words – Six major points:

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- Give – us – this day – our – daily – bread

Our foundation for everything prayed here is who we are praying to

- "Our Father"
- There is nothing singular about this prayer
- Any "my" only has meaning within "Our" (including Jesus)

Romans 12:5, "so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and **individually** members of one another."

I Corinthians 10:17, "For we, though many, are one bread and one body; for we all partake of that one bread."

There is no isolated, singular individuality in Christ!

- He is the only singular individuality, and that...
- With the Father and the Holy Spirit
- Apart from being One together in Him we are nothing!
- Matthew 5:3

There is no such thing as an American Christian!

- **In Christ** there can only be **Christian**Americans

 No Republican, Democrat, conservative or liberal Christians

Galatians 3:28, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

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- **Anything** before Christ, supposedly **defining** our faith in Christ...
- Is Heresy!

I Corinthians 1:12, "Now I say this, that each of you says, 'I am of Paul,' or 'I am of Apollos,' or 'I am of Cephas,' or 'I am of Christ.' Is Christ divided?"

Titus 3:10-11, "Reject a divisive man after the first and second admonition, knowing that such a person is warped and sinning, being self-condemned."

Is this making anyone uncomfortable?

- **Good!** If it is, it needs to.

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Anything other than oneness in Him, misrepresents

Him

- This includes doctrinal I.D. labels
- Calvinist, Methodist, Baptist, Pentecostal, etc.
- **Christ is none of those**. Some are in Him
- Never to the exclusion of each other who are

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Ephesians 2:14-16, "For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity."

Peace = Set at one again... Restored, relational safety & security

With the Father, in Christ, with each other

If we can't embrace that identity without reservation...

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- Then don't pretend to pray the payer
- Because Christ doesn't offer anything less
- Or anything else

Romans 12:3, "For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think"

That gives us a good start on the "us" and "our" when asking for the bread

- We know **who** we are talking to...
- On whose authority, and about whom

..... Since we're not asking by ourselves...

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We're not asking only for ourselves

Our relationship with God in Christ is always about more than ourselves

Philippians 2:3-4, "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others."

He wants to give through us

- Feeding the five thousand...
- He gave **through** them, from what they had

Do we ask so we will be able to give to others?
